

ORDERS OF WORSHIP WITH HOLY COMMUNION

Biblical citations for the First and Third Orders are mostly from the English Standard Version (ESV).

Words in bold are said by the congregation.

First Order for Holy Communion

The Bible is carried into the church.

Call to Worship

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

1Cor. 1:3

A call to worship from Scripture is read, such as one of the following:

Sing, O heavens, for the LORD has done it;
shout, O depths of the earth;
break forth into singing, O mountains,
O forest, and every tree in it!
For the LORD has redeemed Jacob,
and will be glorified in Israel.

Isa. 44.23

Or

Sing for joy, O heavens, and exult, O earth;
break forth, O mountains, into singing!
for the LORD has comforted his people
and will have compassion on his afflicted.

Isa. 49.13

Or

Lift up your heads, O gates!
And be lifted up, you everlasting doors!
And the King of glory shall come in.
Who is this King of glory?
The LORD strong and mighty,
the LORD mighty in battle.

Commandments

The Ten Commandments (Ex.20:2-17) or the two Great Commandments (Matt.22:35-37) may be said. Alternatively they may be said after the sermon in place of the Creed.

Sermon

Before the sermon, the minister says:

After the sermon is concluded, the minister says:

Thanks be to God.

Blessed be our Lord Jesus Christ,
the only Sovereign,
the King of kings, and Lord of Lords,
who alone has immortality,

whom no one has ever seen, nor can see:
to him be honour and power everlasting.

A time of silent meditation may follow.

Creed

The congregation, all standing, say the Nicene Creed, the Apostles' Creed or another appropriate liturgical confession of faith.

Peace

Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you:
not as the world gives, give I to you.
Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Jn.14:27

Brothers and sisters, let us share the peace of Christ with one another.

Peace be with you.

And also with you.

Offering

Each one must give as he has made up his mind,
not reluctantly or under compulsion,
for God loves a cheerful giver.

2 Cor.9:7

Or

Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth,
where moth and rust destroy
and where thieves break in and steal,
but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven,
where neither moth nor rust destroys
and where thieves do not break in and steal.

Let us worship God with our tithes and offerings.

The offering is taken.

If the gifts of bread and wine are not already on the Table, they are brought up and laid upon the Table.

The Eucharist

The minister invites people to the Table with one of the following invitations:

This is the table of our Lord Jesus Christ.
All those who have been baptized in his name,
including children,
are invited to share in this Holy Sacrament.

For by one Spirit were we all baptized into one body,
whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free;
and were all made to drink of one Spirit.

1Co 12:13

Or

Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden,
and I will give you rest.
Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me,
for I am gentle and lowly in heart,
and you will find rest for your souls.
For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Matt.11:28-30

Or

Behold, I stand at the door and knock.
If anyone hears my voice and opens the door,
I will come in to him and eat with him,
and he with me.

Rev.3:20

Then the minister says:

Surely the LORD is in this place!
This is none other but the house of God,
and this is the gate of heaven.

Or

What shall I render unto the LORD for all his benefits toward me?
I will take the cup of salvation, and call upon the name of the LORD.

I will pay my vows unto the LORD now in the presence of all his people.
I will offer to You the sacrifice of thanksgiving,

to be set apart from all common use
to this holy use and mystery;

and as he gave thanks and blessed,
let us draw near to God
and offer our prayers and thanksgiving.

The Lord be with you.

And with your spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is our duty and our greatest joy
to bless You, to praise You,
to thank You, and to worship You,
in every place where Your glory resides,
for great is the majesty of Your name,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
ever-living and ever-merciful God.

You brought us into being out of nothing
and raised us up when we fell.
You left nothing undone
until You led us to heaven

and lavished on us Your future kingdom.
For all these things we thank You,
for the blessings we see and for those we cannot see.
We thank You that You are pleased to accept our worship,
when in heaven
myriads of adoring hosts,
angels and archangels,
cherubim and seraphim,
sing, shout, and cry
one to another:

**Holy, Holy, Holy, is the LORD of hosts,
the whole earth is full of his glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD!

Hosanna in the highest.

*Or the following or another suitable hymn with the same content may
be sung:*

**Holy, holy, holy, LORD God almighty!
All Your works shall praise Your name,
in earth and sky and sea.
Holy, holy, holy, merciful and mighty,
God in three persons, blessed Trinity.**

Holy Father, we too cry out and say:
You are holy and most holy,
You and Your only Son and Your Holy Spirit.
You are holy and most holy,
and great is Your glory.
You so loved the world that You gave Your only-begotten Son,
that whoever believes in him should not perish
but have everlasting life.

Remembering all that he did for us,
the gifts he gave at the Supper,
the cross,
the tomb,
the resurrection on the third day,
the ascension into heaven,
the sitting at your right hand,
and that he will come again in glory,
we offer to You these gifts from Your own gifts,
on behalf of all and for the sake of all.

We praise You, we bless You,
we give thanks to You,
Lord our God.

The following or another suitable hymn with the same theme is sung:

**You are Lord, You are Lord,
You are risen from the dead, and You are Lord.
Every knee shall bow,
every tongue confess that you are Christ, the Lord.**

If the responses are said, the people say:

**Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.**

O God, pour out Your Spirit upon us and upon these gifts.
May this bread and cup be for us
the precious body and blood of Your Christ,
that we who partake of them may not come to judgement,
but may find purity of heart,
the forgiveness of sins,
the fellowship of the Holy Spirit,
the treasures of the kingdom of heaven
and the paradise of Your presence.

With one voice and one burning heart,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
majestic in holiness,
before all ages,
from everlasting to everlasting,
we acclaim You,
we praise You,
we bless You,
we give thanks to You,
we worship You,
now and forever.

The Amen is sung.

The Lord's Prayer is sung, or else said in the following form:

**Our Father, which art in heaven,
hallowed be thy Name.
Thy kingdom come.
Thy will be done in earth,**

**as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive them that trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory,
for ever and ever.
Amen.**

When all have received Communion, the vessels are returned to the Table. The minister concludes:

who heals all your diseases,
who redeems your life from the pit,
who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,
who satisfies you with good
so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

Intimations

Prayer of Intercession

The prayer of intercession may take the form of a litany such as the following. Each bidding is followed by a pause.

In peace let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For the unity of the Church of God,
the salvation of all people
and the peace of the whole world,
let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For our congregation,
for all who enter here with faith, reverence and the fear of God,
and for all those who seek the truth,
let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For our Presbytery and Session,
for all who hold office in the Church,
and for all of Christ's faithful servants,
let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For our city,
for every city and town

and for the faithful who live in them,
let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For good weather,
an abundance of crops and a healthy economy,
let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For those who travel long distances, by land, sea and air,
for the sick, the suffering, those in prison,
and for their salvation,
let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For deliverance from hardship, danger and distress,
let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

Help us, save us,
have mercy upon us, and protect us,
O God, by Your grace.

Lord, have mercy.

Let us commit ourselves and one another
and our whole lives to the Lord,
whose power is beyond compare,
whose glory is beyond our understanding,
whose mercy is boundless,
and whose love for us is impossible to comprehend.
Lord, look on us and on this church in Your compassion.
Give us and those who pray with us Your abundant mercy.
For to You belong all glory, honour, and worship,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
now and for ever.

Commission

The minister dismisses the congregation with a charge such as one of the following:

I call heaven and earth to witness against you today,
that I have set before you
life and death,
blessing and curse.
Therefore choose life, that you and your family may live.

Deut.30:19

Or

Jesus said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations,
baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit,
teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.
And behold, I am with you always,
to the end of the age.'

Benediction

Now may the God of peace
who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus,
the great shepherd of the sheep,
by the blood of the eternal covenant,
equip you with everything good that you may do his will,
working in us that which is pleasing in his sight,
through Jesus Christ,
to whom be glory forever and ever.

The Bible is carried out of the church. It may be followed by the bread and wine, the offerings, the Communion elders and the minister, in procession.

Second Order for Holy Communion

Peace and Offering

After the Order for the Word is completed with an ascription of glory or a period of meditation and brief prayer and/or the saying of a creed or declaration of faith, a hymn on the theme of the sermon or a Communion hymn may be sung.

The offering is taken up.

As the last part of the hymn is being sung, the offering and the bread and wine, if not already on the Table, are brought up to the Table.

If no hymn has been sung, the congregation may stand as the offering is brought forward and sing a short doxology such as the following.

**Praise God, from whom all blessings flow,
in heaven above and earth below;
one God, three persons, we adore-
to this God praise for evermore!**

If the bread and wine are already on the Table, they are unveiled.

Jesus said:

(If you are about to place your gift on the altar
and remember that someone is angry with you,
leave your gift there in front of the altar.)

First go and make peace with your brother, your sister:
then come back and offer your gift to God.

Matt.5:23f.

Or

Jesus said:

Peace I leave with you;
my peace I give to you.

(I do not give to you as the world gives.
Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not be afraid.) *Jn.14:27*

The peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.

Peace be with you.

Before we offer our gifts and come to the Lord 's table,
let us share this peace with one another.

Those holding the offering bags or plates leave them at the Table.

All share the peace with their neighbours saying:

Peace with you.

And with you.

*Those who brought up the offerings stand in front of the Table.
If the people are to be served in their pews, the appointed elders
stand with them.*

Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory,
the splendour and the majesty;
for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.

All things come from you,
and of your own do we give to you.

2 Chr.29:11,14

A doxology may be sung, if one has not been sung before.

The congregation is then seated, the appointed elders at the Table.

Invitation

Jesus Christ is risen! He stands among us as the living Lord
and invites us to his holy table.

It is his table, not ours, and he has prepared it for his disciples.
In his name we invite to the joyful feast all who turn from their sins,
trust in him as their Saviour, and seek to live a new life
in the power of his Spirit and at peace with all their neighbours.

Or

This is the table of the Lord,
and for all who want to love him more.

So come, you who have much faith and you who have little,
made ready for all who love him

you who come often, and you who do not come often enough
you who have tried to follow and you who have failed.

Come because the Lord invites us all to meet him here.

Brothers and sisters, listen to the gracious words
with which he bids us come to him and assures us of his welcome:

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,
for they will be filled.

Matt.5:6

Or

Listen! I stand at the door and knock.

If anyone hears my voice and opens the door,
I will come in to be with him and eat with him,
and he with me.

Rev.3:21

Let us say together:

**We come to your table, Lord,
trusting not in any goodness of our own,
but only in your great mercy.
For we are unworthy to eat
even the crumbs that fall from your table,
but you have declared to us your grace;
you have called us to your banquet.
So by your Spirit feed us now
with your body and blood,
that you may live in us and we in you for ever.
Amen.**

Following the example of our Lord
and obeying his command,
we do this to commemorate him
and be united to him in his death and resurrection.

As the Lord Jesus,
on the night he was betrayed,
took bread,
so I take these elements of bread and wine,
to be set apart from all common use
to this holy use and mystery;

*The minister lifts the paten and then the chalice from the Table and
lays his hands on the other vessels.*

and as he then gave thanks to God,
let us draw near to offer our prayers and thanksgiving.

The Lord is here.

God's Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts!

We lift them up to the Lord!

The people may stand.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God!

It is right to give God thanks and praise!

*The minister lifts up his hands and leads in one of the following four
Prayers.*

*The prayer may include (before the Sanctus) thanks for our
communion with all the saints, for the great witnesses of the faith in
the past and for departed loved ones (who should be named if they
have died recently).*

First Prayer of Thanksgiving

Almighty God, we thank you for making all things through your
Word,
for commanding light to shine in the darkness,
for stretching out the heavens and laying the foundations of the
earth,
for creating us in your image and keeping us safe in your faithful
love.

In silence we each thank you now for particular blessings in our
lives....

So with all the angels and archangels
we proclaim your great and glorious Name,
for ever worshipping you and saying/singing together:

**Holy, holy, holy LORD God Almighty,
heaven and earth are full of your glory;
glory be to you, Lord most high.**

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD!

Thank you for the Law and the Prophets, who show your purpose to
us.

But above all we thank you, O God, for Jesus Christ your only Son,

the bread and wine in a circle. The minister should then invite
everyone forward, including any who will not consume the elements.
If the congregation is large, it may come forward a row at a time and
receive the bread and wine from the minister and an assisting elder.*

*As each person is handed the bread and the wine, the same versicle
and response are said.*

*After the vessels have all been returned to the Table, the minister
says:*

Because there is one loaf, we who are many form one body
For we all share the same bread. *1 Cor.10:17*

*The minister may invite anyone in need of ministry to come forward or
to remain behind afterwards.*

The following acclamation may be said:

Praise the LORD, my soul!
All my being, praise his holy name!
Praise the LORD, my soul
And do not forget how kind he is!
He forgives all my sins
And heals all my diseases!
He saves me from the grave
And blesses me with love and mercy!

Visitors may be invited to identify themselves and be welcomed.

The congregation may be asked to stand.

The appointed person leads the prayers from the pews or from the front.

and for those who administer justice.
May they do their work faithfully and diligently.
Keep all who work in such positions from sloth,
and let them realise that one faithful person can make all the
difference.

We pray for those in our country ravaged by the scourge of AIDS.
Fill us with godly compassion for them;
give us new vigour to do what we can to alleviate their suffering.
Give comfort and hope to those who have the disease,
may they use their lives for the good of others,
and for the betterment of society.

Gracious Father, we pray for Your Church,
holy, catholic and apostolic,
which you love and for which you gave your Son.
Help us to serve the Church, but more,
help us to love the Church,
as Christ loves the Church and gives himself for her.
Guide and govern us,
Unite all who love the Lord Jesus in Spirit and in truth.
Keep your Church from division, heresy, and pettiness,
keep us from being conformed to the pattern of the world,
keep us pure, and holy, and zealous for good works.
Teach us to accept people who are different from us.
Keep us from discrimination, bigotry, racism,
and all such evils.

We pray for those who lead us,
for our Presbytery and Session,
for our Session Clerk and Treasurer,
for our Sunday school teachers,
for those who exercise other offices,
and for all those faithful workers
who in their own quiet and dignified way
do the work that no one else can do or is prepared to do.

Lord, we pray for the our families.

Protect them from danger and from temptation.
We pray for our spouses and for our children.
May they learn that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.
We pray for our parents and relatives:
teach us to honour and love them.

We plead for those who do not know the truth of the Gospel,
for those who seek You,
but have not yet found You.
Lord, lead them to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

We commend to your fatherly goodness
all those who are afflicted and distressed,
those who are sick, lonely, or depressed,
those who are trapped by addictions or vice.
In particular we lift before you ...

Comfort and relieve these in their need,
give them patience in their sufferings,
and show them a way through their troubles.
